

Annan Road


Calder Road

Calder Road

Calder Road is an OO scale layout, representing a little bit of railway on the fringes of an urban area in central Scotland where the railway has survived into the 21st century in spite of the general decline of the railway system.


Area = 147 square feet or 15.8 square metres



Mordaunt Street

Mordaunt Street is an O Gauge layout based in the south east of Glasgow. In the 19th century this part of Glasgow was heavily developed with a wide variety of industries and many of these were served by the railways. The model represents a fictitious station built to service the considerable number of workmen and women who commuted to the area each day. The building is based on the last remaining part of the old Caledonian Railway Hamilton Central Station.

It requires 4 operators.

STANLEY JUNCTION

This is our new N Gauge Layout which is on track to be completed in early 2018.

Stanley Junction is about 8 miles north of Perth on what was the Caledonian Railway's main line from Perth to Aberdeen via Forfar. It was an important junction where the Highland Railway main line to Inverness began. Our N gauge model shows the unusual track layout before the Caledonian line was partially closed in 1967 and then used only for freight as far as Forfar. It closed completely in 1982 leaving only the connection to the Highland line.
